Fuel Poverty and Winter Deaths

We have ben invited to take part in a Joint Scutiny Review about Fuel Poverty and Winter Deaths. This is a joint initiative between Warwickshire County Council and Coventry City Council. Some of the issues they are investigating are:

- how older people are affected by high fuel costs
- what support is already available across agencies and in communities
- the ways in which help, advice and support can be given in a more effective manner
- housing (general standards and insulation)
- social isolation.

Age Discrimination

Age discrimination legislation has been delayed by up to 18 months and actual legislation to outlaw ageism in GP surgeries, hospitals and social care are in danger and may not even be drafted before the next general election. We encourage everyone to write to your MP asking them to sign Early Day Motion (EDM 458) to ensure that this legislation is on the statute books before the next election.

Health, Social Care and You

As a Branch we have regularly liaised and attended meetings with the local NHS/PCT meetings always putting forward the pensioners point of view. We have tried to keep abreast of changes and where possible make suggestions for improvement of services.

The Government has recently set up the Care Quality Commission. This was established to regulate the quality of health and adult social care and look after the interests of people detained under the Mental Health Act. From the 1st April 2009 the Care Quality Commission will bring together the work of the Commission for Social Care Inspection, The Healthcare Commission and the Mental Health Act Commission, creating for the first time an independent regulator of health, mental health and social care in England.

Their primary aim is to put the people who use the services first. From April 2009 NHS providers will be required to register with the Care Quality Commission.

Coventry Pensioners Convention has been asked to play a part at a National level in the consultation on the proposed policy of the Care Quality Commission and the enforcement of its powers.

The draft policy sets out how the Care Quality Commission intend to use their enforcement powers to protect the health, safety and welfare of people who use health and social care care services, and to improve the quality of these services. It includes the principles they will follow when doing this.

We have completed two weeks of intense consultation making comments on every question raised..

National Day of Action

On the 6th April the State pension will rise by just £4.55 per week and £2.70 for millions of women who rely on their husbands contributions. This will raise the State pension to a mere £95.25 for a single Pensioner. Such a low state basic pension means that millions of Pensioners remain on means tested benefits and today's workers face poverty when they retire. Only a decent state pension provides an effective and reliable way of guaranteeing financial security in retirement.

Around 62% of pensioner couples have an income of £15,000 or less, and 45% of all single pensioners have an income of £10,000 or less. Means tested benefits fail to reach 1.8m pensioners who are eligible to claim.
